

Welcome...

Park & Ride is part of a broader transportation strategy for the medieval city of Salisbury. Salisbury District Council and Wiltshire County Council are working together to implement the Salisbury Transport Plan which seeks to reduce traffic congestion and air pollution and encourage people to use other, more environmentally acceptable modes of transport than the car.



Park & Ride is an important part of this plan because it reduces the number of car journeys into the city centre.

Salisbury has four Park & Ride sites: Wilton (to the west), Beehive (to the north), London Road (to the north-east), and Britford (to the south). Together, the four sites accommodate nearly 1,700 vehicles.

HOW PARK & RIDE WORKS

Opening hours

All sites operate the following hours:
 Monday - Friday: 06.45hrs to 20.00hrs
 Saturday: 07.15hrs to 19.30hrs
 Sundays and Bank Holidays: Sorry, not open

Fares and tickets

One driver and up to six passengers can travel together on the same ticket. You can use your ticket on all Park & Ride services as many times as you wish all day.

How to use the ticket

- Take ticket from entry machine at barrier
- Park car in marked bay
- Get on the bus and show your ticket to driver
- Before you can leave the car park the ticket needs to be validated at the ticket machines in the building. This can be done before or after you travel into the city.
- Insert validated ticket at exit barrier

Change

Change is available from all pay machines on site.

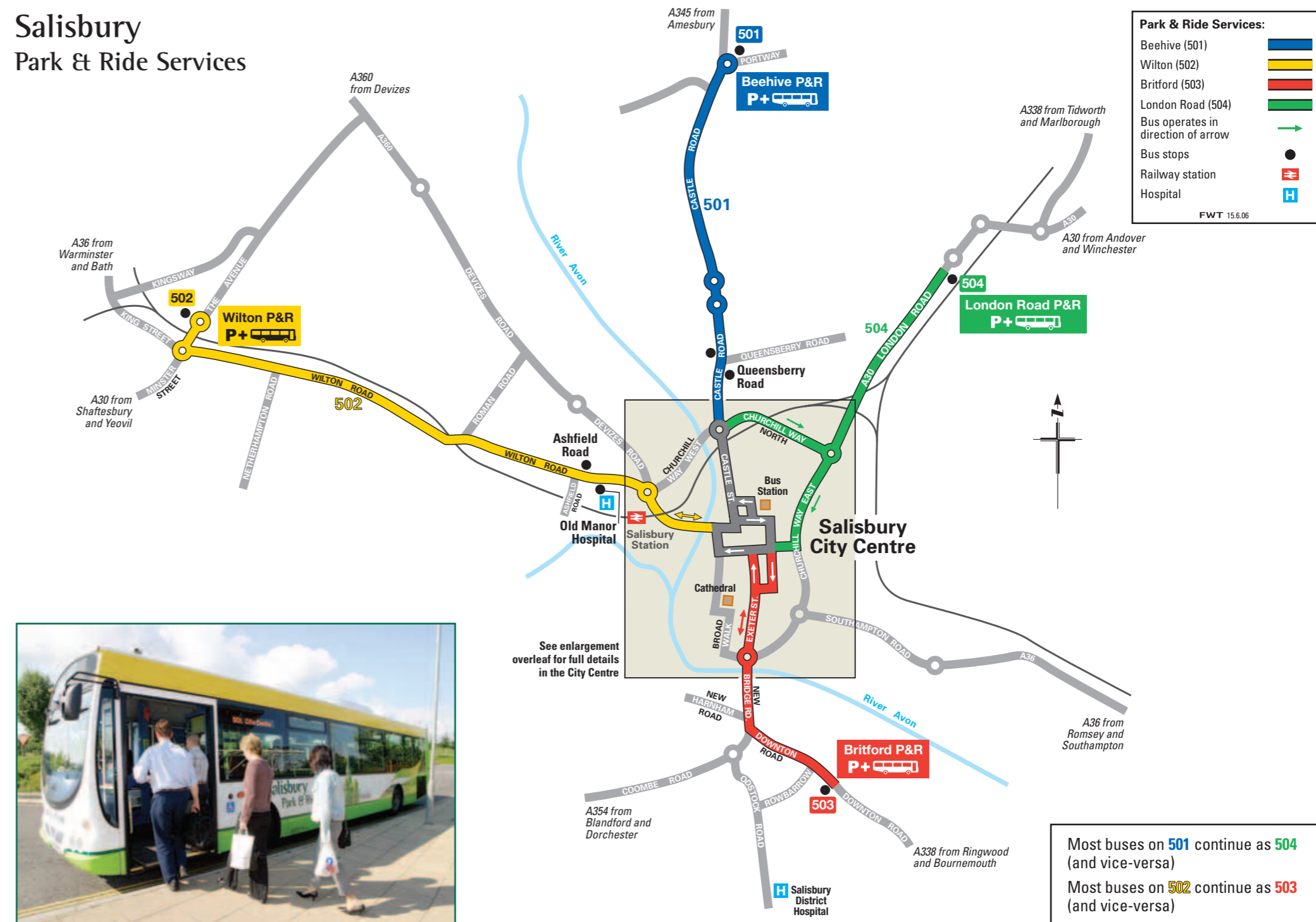

FIRST BUS 0740	Buses generally run every 10 minutes from 0900 until 1800 and every 15 minutes at other times	LAST BUS 1855

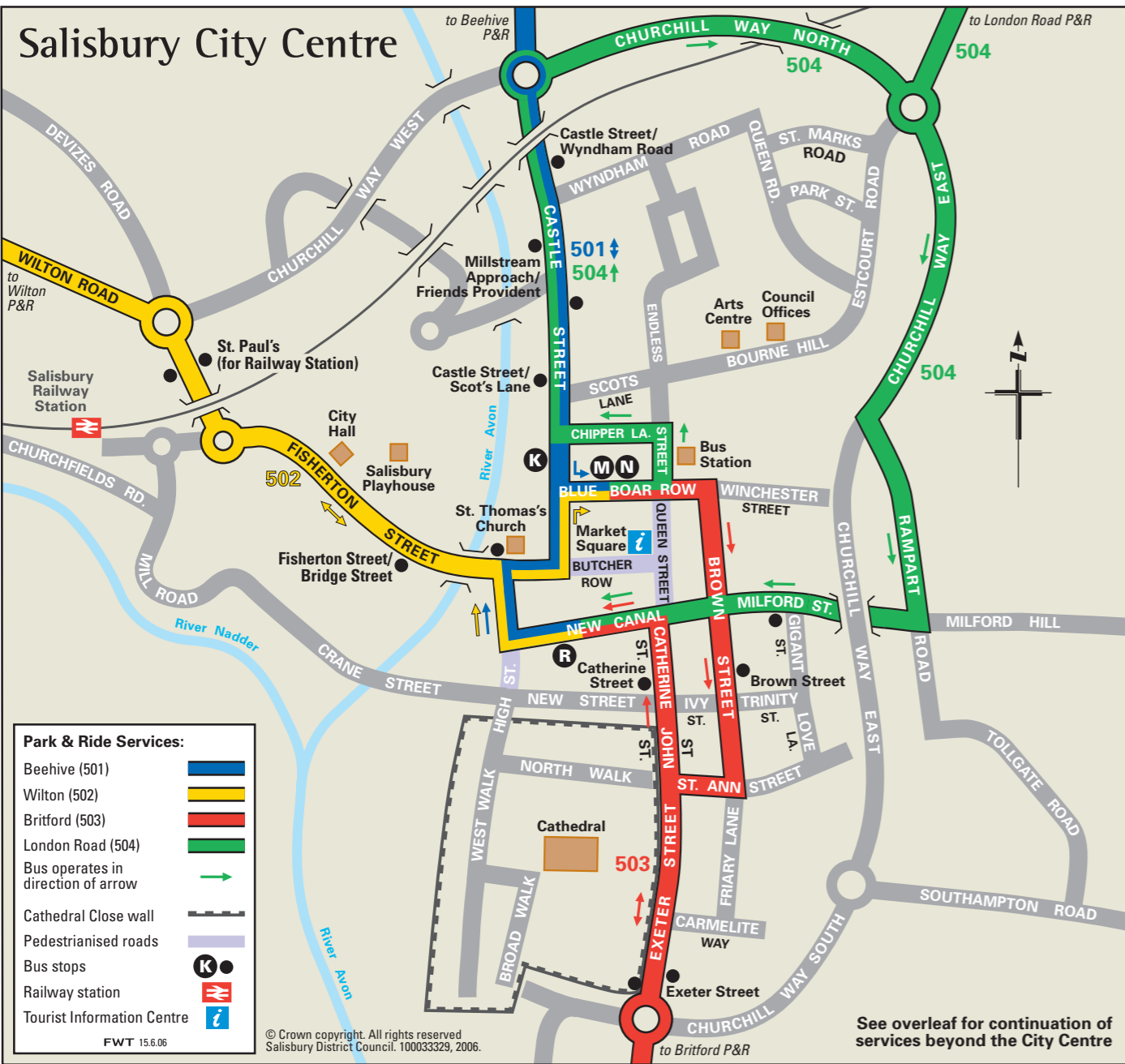
Normal journey times:

Beehive – between 8 and 16 minutes
 Wilton – between 10 and 20 minutes
 Britford – between 10 and 15 minutes
 London Road – between 8 and 12 minutes

Where to catch your bus in the city centre

Beehive (501) - stop R, New Canal (outside Marks & Spencer) or stop K, Castle St (Tesco)

Wilton (502) - stop R, New Canal (outside Marks & Spencer)

Britford (503) - stop N, Blue Boar Row (near Natwest)

London Road (504) - stop M, Blue Boar Row (near Debenhams)

Most buses on **501** continue as **504** (and vice-versa)

Most buses on **502** continue as **503** (and vice-versa)

Why use Park & Ride?



Salisbury Park & Ride is aimed at commuters and other long-stay users. It also offers a good way to get into the city for shoppers and visitors who may be staying for a few hours or the whole day.

Park & Ride is cheaper than parking long stay in the city centre and it offers nearly 1,700 spaces.

The benefits to you

- An easy, affordable and stress-free way of accessing the offices, shops and attractions of Salisbury city centre
- An opportunity to reduce your daily travel costs - a driver and up to six passengers can travel together on one ticket
- 'Real time' passenger information, thanks to the city-wide system that lets you know when there's a bus on its way
- A frequent and fast journey into the city - Park & Ride buses benefit from having priority at some traffic signals to speed their journey
- Your Park & Ride ticket allows you free travel all day on all Salisbury Park & Ride Services (**501, 502, 503, 504**)
- Easy-to-access, low-floor buses, making it easier for wheelchair users, those with walking difficulties, parents with child buggies or passengers with luggage. Disabled parking spaces are available next to the bus terminal
- Comfortable on-site facilities - a waiting area for those waiting for companions, or during the short intervals between buses. Toilet facilities are available. These include disabled toilets and baby changing facilities
- Safe and secure parking - all sites have a high level of security, with 'Secured Car Park' status. Security includes a parking attendant on site during opening hours, 24-hour CCTV coverage and help-points located at all ticket machines and barriers, linked directly to the attendant's office and to the council's 24-hour CCTV control room
- High quality buses - many with on-board CCTV
