New for 2011 Willow and Hedgerow Weaving

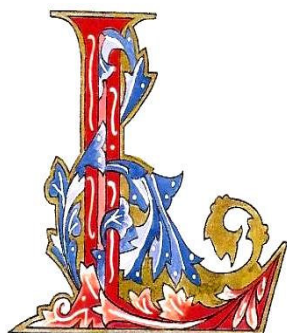
Saturday 26 March 2011

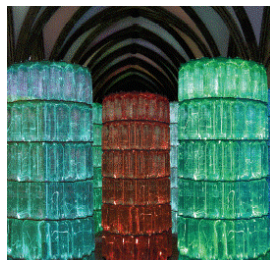
