Music during the summer

As always, we are grateful to the visiting choirs who provide such a rich variety of music while the Cathedral musicians are enjoying a well-deserved break. During the summer, most of the choirs stay for several days, which gives everyone the chance to feel more at home. Immediately after the end of term, we welcome the Salisbury Liturgical Music Course, who have chosen music which is either traditional plainchant, or is based on it. Their choices include some fine Latin settings of the evening canticles from the Renaissance as well as the richly romantic setting of *Blessed city, heavenly Salem*, by Edward Bairstow. Later in the summer, it will be good to welcome a choir from The Netherlands. Many of their pieces are staples of the Victorian repertoire including music by Stainer, Harwood and Stanford – interestingly, no Dutch composers are represented.

Our visitors from Toronto have included music by Healey Willan, one of the most respected Canadian composers as well as a Palestrina Mass and motets by the Renaissance master Josquin des Prez. At the end of August, there is the chance to enjoy canticles by Christopher Tye and a Monteverdi setting of the Mass during the residency of the Naylor Singers, who also include some more contemporary repertoire. It's wonderful to know that the Cathedral will still be ringing with music throughout the summer months, thanks to all the singers, conductors and organists who contribute so much to our worship.

You can also hear two fine organ recitals (see right); Iain Quinn on 14 July and Graham Barber 11 August.

Sculpture Exhibitions

Liminality - Toward the Unknown Region

Monday 13 September – Friday 12 November

Major exhibition of contemporary sculptures in and around the Cathedral, created by eight renowned British based sculptors – Jay Battle ARBS, Sean Henry ARBS, James Jones, Jonathan Loxley, Rebecca Newnham, Keith Rand RSA, Roger Stephens and Benjamin Storch.

**Light Showers and Water Towers, Bruce Munro**

December 2010 to late February 2011.

Two large-scale illuminated artworks, one for inside the Cathedral, and the other for the adjoining Cloisters. Munro installs 'Light Shower' for the start of Advent (end of November) high up in the Spire Crossing from where it cascades with 2000 points of light.

Water Towers (from January 2011) is a maze of huge towers made of stacked recycled water bottles illuminated with fibre optics powered by energy-conserving LED lamps, which change colour synchronized to choral music.
